

**WATER** Water is a ubiquitous chemical substance that is composed of hydrogen and oxygen and is vital for all known forms of life. In typical usage, water refers only to its liquid form or state, but the substance also has a solid state, ice, and a gaseous state, water vapor or steam. Water covers 71% of the Earth's surface. On Earth, it is found mostly in oceans and other large water bodies, with 1.6% of water below ground in aquifers and 0.001% in the air as vapor, clouds (formed of solid and liquid water particles suspended in air), and precipitation. Oceans hold 97% of surface water, glaciers and polar ice caps 2.4%, and other land surface water such as rivers, lakes and ponds 0.6%. A very small amount of the Earth's water is contained within biological bodies and manufactured products. Water on Earth moves continually through a cycle of evaporation or transpiration, precipitation, and runoff, usually reaching the sea. Over land, evaporation and transpiration contribute to the precipitation over land.

**RITUAL WASHING** Water is considered a purifier in most religions. Major faiths that incorporate ritual washing (ablution) include Christianity, Hinduism, Rastafari movement, Islam, Shinto, Taoism, and Judaism. Immersion (or aspersion or affusion) of a person in water is a central sacrament of Christianity (where it is called baptism); it is also a part of the practice of other religions, including Judaism (mikvah) and Sikhism (Amrit Sanskar). In addition, a ritual bath in pure water is performed for the dead in many religions including Judaism and Islam. In Islam, the five daily prayers can be done in most cases after completing washing certain parts of the body using clean water (wudu). In Shinto, water is used in almost all rituals to cleanse a person or an area (e.g., in the ritual of misogi). Water is mentioned in the Bible 442 times in the New International Version and 363 times in the King James Version: 2 Peter 3:5(b) states, "The earth was formed out of water and by water" (NIV). In the Koran it is stated that "Living things are made of water" and it is often used to describe Paradise.

**CONFESSION** In many faiths and practices, confession is similar to a criminal confession - an admission of one's guilt. The intent of this sacrament is to provide healing for the soul as well as to regain the grace of God, lost by sin.

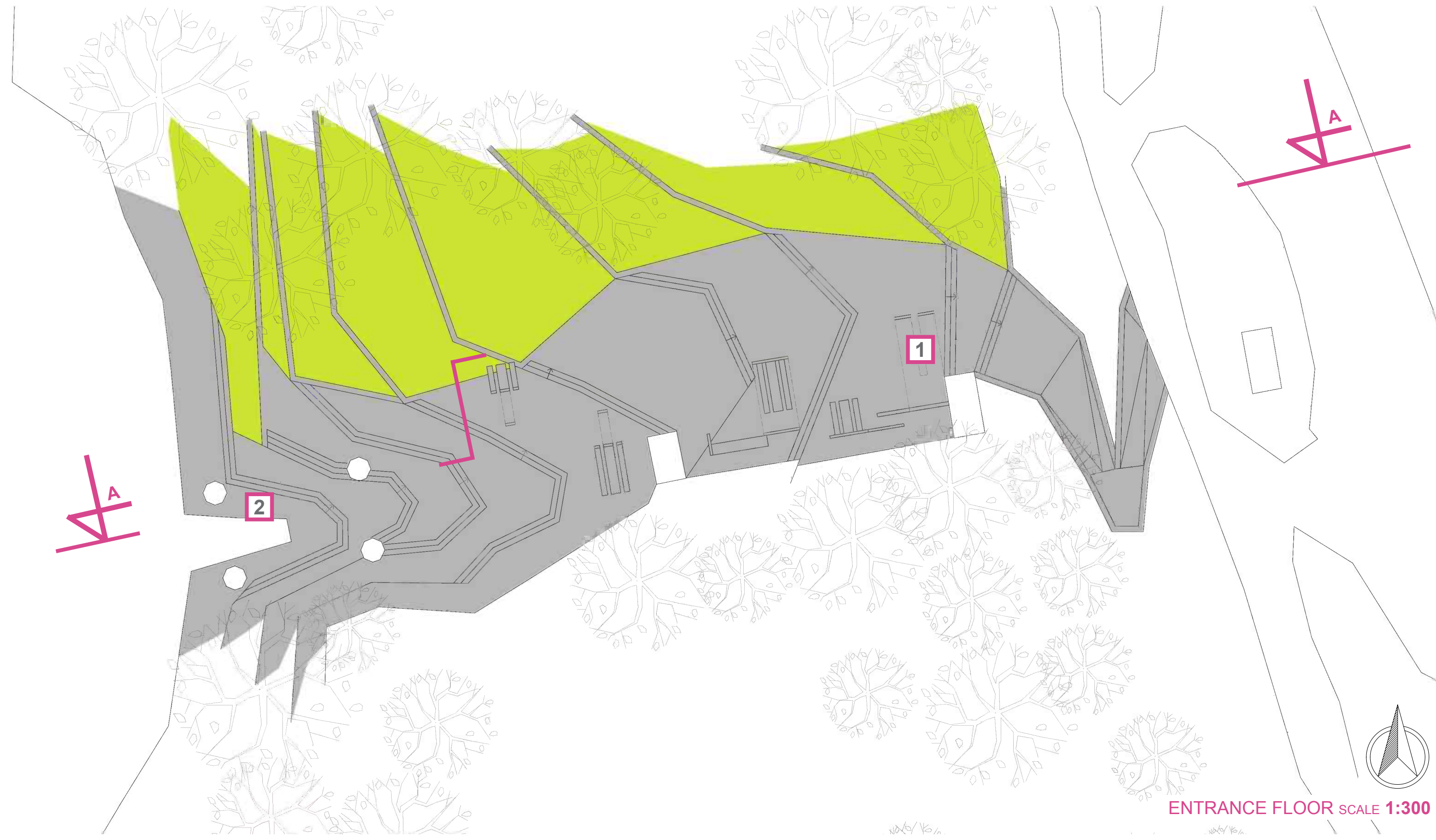

**3** The third and the last station is the hill top of Sandberg. People come here tired, exhausted, thirsty, dirty, sweaty... They pour our carried water from sac into a well. Now they can wash down physically but also psychically. All dirty, sand is gone and just like that all sins are washed down, too. Sins caused by destroying nature, Sandberg by building cableway. Personal sins are gone, too. Now people are awarded with beautiful views of Morava, Devin... The biggest reward is human's purification. The gesture of the last station is symbolic to the place. 2 Peter 3:5(b) states, "The earth was formed out of water and by water" (NIV).
